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**PULLOVER · TWIN 50G & TWIN 25G**  
Design 50 – Filati Journal 62

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**Size** 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

**Materials:** 150 (200, 250) g of Lana Grossa **Twin 50g** (46% baby alpaca, 45% Merino wool, 9% polyamide; 85 m/50 g) in Light Green/Dark Green/Red/Rust/Yellow/Olive (**col 208**) and 75 g of Lana Grossa **Twin 25g** (37% baby alpaca, 37% Merino wool, 26% polyamide; 200 m/25 g) in Dark Green/Light Green/Grey Green/Red/Dark Red/Blue Violet (**col 108**). Size 4 and 7 mm needles; size 4 mm circular needle, 40 cm long.

**Rib patt:** K1, p1.

**St st:** K on RS, p on WS.

**Sleeve patt:** Multiple of 4 + 1 + 2 selvage sts. **Row 1 (RS):** Selvage st, p2, \* sl 1 kwise wyib, p3; rep from \* to last 4 sts, sl 1 kwise wyib, p2, selvage st. **Row 2 (WS):** Selvage st, k2, \* p1, k3; rep from \* to last 4 sts, p1, k2, selvage st. Rep rows 1 and 2 for sleeve patt.

**Selvage stitches:** On every row: Sl first st kwise, k last st.

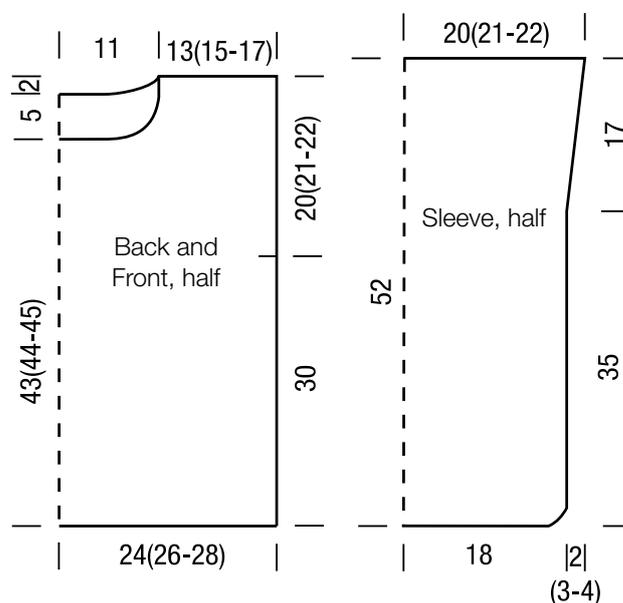
**Gauges:** 10 sts and 19 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st with size 7 mm needles and Twin 50g; 21 sts and 34 rows = 10 x 10 cm in sleeve patt with size 4 mm needles and Twin 25g.

**Back:** With size 7 mm needles and Twin 50g, cast on 50 (54, 58) sts. Next row (WS): Work in rib patt. Work in St st until piece meas 30 cm from cast-on. Place marker in first and last st on last WS row to indicate beg of armholes. Cont until piece meas 43 (49, 50) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape neck: Next row (RS): Bind off center 16 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 3 sts at each neck edge 1 time and when piece meas 2 cm from beg of neck shaping, bind off rem 14 (16, 18) sts for each shoulder.

**Front:** Work same as back until piece meas 43 (44, 45) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape neck: Next row (RS): Bind off center 10 sts. Working each side separately, bind off 3 sts at each neck edge 1 time, 2 sts 1 time, 1 st 1 time and when same length as back to shoulders, bind off rem 14 (16, 18) sts for each shoulder.

**Sleeves:** With size 4 mm needles and Twin 25g, cast on 38 sts. Next row (RS): K1, k1f&b in each st to end = 75 sts. Work in sleeve patt until piece meas 35 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape sleeve: Inc 1 st at each end of next RS row, then every 12th row 4 times (then every 10th row 5 times / then every 8th row 6 times) = 85 (87, 89) sts. Work increased sts into patt. Work even in patt until piece meas 52 cm from cast-on. Bind off all sts.

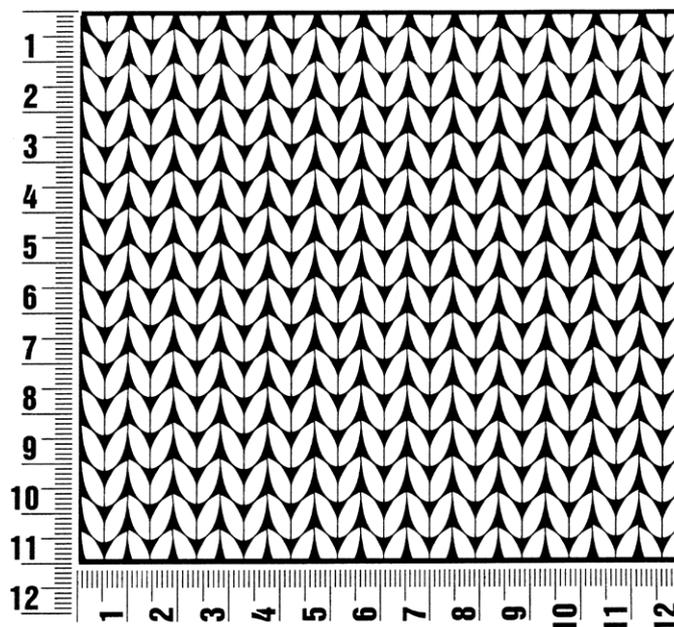
**Finishing:** Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. **Neckband:** With size 4 mm circular needle and Twin 25g, pick up and k 120 sts evenly around neck edge. Place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work rib patt in rnds for 6 cm. Loosely bind off all sts in rib. Fold neckband in half to WS and sew down. Sew on sleeves between markers. Sew side and sleeve seams.



## Gauge Swatch

### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.



## Abbreviations

**beg** = begin(ning) · **ch** = chain · **cont** = continue · **dec** = decreas(e)(ing) · **inc** = increas(e)(ing) · **k** = knit · **kwise** = as if to knit  
**meas** = measures · **M1L** = lift strand between sts from front to back and knit this strand through the back loop · **M1R** = lift strand between sts from the back and knit this strand through the front loop · **patt** = pattern · **pm** = place marker · **p** = purl  
**pwise** = as if to purl · **rem** = remain(ing) · **rep** = repeat(s) · **rev St st** = reverse stockinette stitch · **rnd(s)** = round(s) · **RS** = right side · **sc** = single crochet · **skp** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 1 stitch, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **sk2p** = slip 1 stitch as if to knit, knit 2 together, pass slipped stitch over knitted stitch · **s2kp** = slip 2 stitches as if to knit, k 1 stitch, pass slipped stitches over knitted stitch · **sl** = slip · **st(s)** = stitch(es) · **St st** = stockinette stitch · **tbl** = through the back loop · **tog** = together · **wyib** = with yarn in back of work · **wyif** = with yarn in front of work · **WS** = wrong side · **yo(s)** = yarn over(s)
