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# **SLIPOVER CONFETTI**

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## Design 2 – Flyer Confetti



**Size** 36/38 (40/42, 44)

Instructions are given for first size. Figures in parenthesis refer to larger sizes. When only one figure is given, it applies to all sizes.

**Materials:** 500 (600, 600) g of Lana Grossa **Confetti** (100% Merino wool; 50 m/100 g) in Lilac/Blue Violet/Rust/Mustard/Off White/Petrol (**col 6**). Size 12 mm needles; one set size 12 mm double-pointed needles [dpns].

**Rib patt:** K1, p1.

**St st:** K on RS, p on WS.

**Selvage sts:** K on RS, p on WS.

**Twisted garter selvage:** On RS row, ktbl first st, sl last st pwise wyib. On WS row, ptbl first st, sl last st pwise wyif.

**Full-fashion decrease 1:** At beg of RS row, twisted garter selvage, p1, k1, p1, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 6 sts, k2tog, p1, k1, p1, twisted garter selvage.

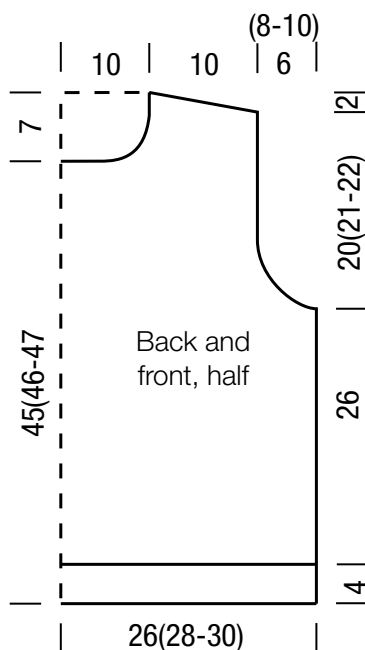
**Full-fashion decrease 2:** At beg of RS row, selvage st, k1, skp; at end of RS row, work to last 4 sts, k2tog, k1, selvage st.

**Gauge:** 7 sts and 9 rows = 10 x 10 cm in St st on size 12 mm needles.

**Back:** Cast on 39 (41, 43) sts. Next row (WS): Selvage st, \* k1, p1; rep from \* to last 2 sts, k1, selvage st. Work in rib patt as set by last row for a total of 3 rows. Work in St st until piece meas 30 cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape armholes: Working full-fashion dec 1, dec 1 st at each end of next 4 (5, 6) RS rows = 31 sts. Maintaining twisted garter selvage and 3 sts in rib patt at each edge, cont in St st until armhole meas 20 (21, 22) cm, ending with a WS row. Shape shoulders: At each shoulder edge bind off 4 sts 2 times. Place rem 15 sts on holder.

**Front:** Work same as back until piece meas 45 (46, 47) cm from cast-on, ending with a WS row. Shape neck: Next row (RS): Place center 9 sts on holder. Working each side separately and working full-fashion dec 2, dec 1 st at each neck edge every RS row 3 times and when same length as back to shoulders, shape shoulders same as for back. No sts rem.

**Finishing:** Pin pieces to measurements and block. Sew shoulder seams. **Collar:** With dpns, pick up and k 34 sts evenly around neck edge including sts on holders. Arrange sts evenly on 4 needles = 8-9-8-9 sts per needle, place beg of rnd marker and join for working in rnds. Work in rib patt for 10 cm. Bind off all sts in rib. Sew side seams.



## Gauge Swatch

### Before you begin ...

...make a gauge swatch. Use the recommended needles, yarns and pattern stitch for your gauge swatch. It should measure approx. 12 cm x 12 cm. Cast-on and bind-off rows, as well as selvage stitches should not be included in the measurement. Pin your swatch and block it as you would the finished pieces of the garment. Count stitches and rows over 10 cm. If your gauge swatch is too small, switch to larger needles. If your gauge swatch is too big, switch to smaller needles.
